PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

The death of HB 104, Firearms Protection Act, will be well remembered and well resented by the freedom minded people of this state.

This bold measure would have laid a blanket of protection over our constitutional and natural right to own those firearms and magazines best suited for the defense of our persons, families, communities and state. Senator Leland Christensen, however, to his immense and permanent discredit, added in committee the modern equivalent of the smallpox virus to that blanket.

Just as the contaminated blanket givers of old lied to the Indians, "I am your friend," Senator Christensen untruthfully proclaimed his vows to the Constitution and his devotion to the Second Amendment: the treachery no less heinous.

Then, showing the utmost contempt for the intelligence of the people of Wyoming, Senator Phil Nicholas, with a perfectly straight face, had the crust to blame his refusal to allow a full senate vote on HB 104 on Anthony Bouchard, director of Gun Owners Of Wyoming.

Anthony, who had conducted himself as a complete gentleman throughout the entire legislative process, played a major role in getting firearms protection through the Wyoming House. By trying to blame Anthony, Senator Nicholas engaged in one of the most despicable examples of projection I have ever witnessed.
