2015 BALLOT

Well over a century ago Otto Von Bismark commented "Two things one would rather not watch are sausages being made and legislation being passed." This year's Wyoming Senate certainly verified what the Iron Chancellor said way back when.

I attended the Senate hearing for HB 114, the bill to end Gun Free Zones in Wyoming which had easily passed the House. To put it mildly, it was a most unpleasant experience. The Powers that Be in Wyoming wanted the bill killed but lacked the testicular fortitude to do so in an honest and open manner. The committee instead submitted a completely different, unpleasant, meaningless, and unpassable substitute bill and called it an "amendment."

The public comments, limited to two minutes each, were but a mere formality as the committee members had already made their decision. What was mildly entertaining was the appearance of those who opposed ending "Gun Free Zones". Several generations ago one would have to have paid admission to see such as those. Today, should one wish to see them one would have to go to a 24 hour Walmart after midnight. While they lived in Wyoming, they in no way could be considered "Wyoming people."

After the committee made the pre-planned decision to pass the counterfeit "amended" bill the entire Senate spent several hours "debating" it. The "debate" was a buffoonish exercise which only served to debase what little dignity the Senate had managed to preserve over the years. Third reading ended the farce as the now completely tainted HB-114 finally died.

On a more cheerful note the Newcastle Gun Show was a great deal of fun. The "off their medicine" dealers took their grossly over-priced merchandise home with them Sunday afternoon. The more reasonably priced vendors did well. I was expecially pleased to see the \$5.50/bx on up .22 ammo remain untouched, un-looked at, and unsold.

Shooting Sports Heritage Foundation of Wyoming (SSHFWY) Grants – SSHFWY is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public charity corporation whose mission is to preserve and enrich shooting sports in Wyoming by receiving donations from shooting sports-minded benefactors, and distributing those funds as grants to qualified like-minded Wyoming organizations for purposes that enhance shooting sports experiences of the general Wyoming public. Virtually all donations received by SSHFWY will be distributed as grants to qualified applicants. Having now established a small funds base, SSHFWY will award up to \$1000 in grants in 2015 (individual grants limited to \$500) to qualified organizations focusing on youth activities or programs. As our funds base increases in the future, SSHFWY will expand the number and scope of grants accordingly. Grant application forms will be available on our website (www.sshfwy.org) by May 1st. Grant applications must be submitted by July 1st, and grants will be awarded by September 1st.

WY 3 POSITION AIR RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2015 Wyoming State 3 Position Air Rifle championship was held at the Lander Valley Sportsmen's Assn indoor range April 11th, 2015. Over 40 junior shooters from around the state made the trek to Lander to compete for an opportunity to represent Wyoming at the National 3P Air Rifle Championships to be held in Anniston, AL this summer.

In the precision rifle team event, the Lander Junior Rifle & Pistol Club just barely edged out the Laramie County 4-H Shooters by just 19 points, 2123 to 2104(out of possible 2400). In the precision rifle individual event, Laramie County shooter Ashley Swearingen was the Champion shooter with a score of 562, Flint Pokorny of Lander 2nd 558, and Tana Eberhardt 3rd with a 551.(out of a possible 600)

In the Sporter Rifle team competition Cheyenne East High School swept both 1st and 2nd place with scores of 1921 and 1836(out of a possible 2400).

First place individual shooter was Cheyenne East's Dustin Hauf with a 504. In second was Christopher Fritsch also of Cheyenne with a 502 and rounding out the top 3 was Kaitlyn Archuleta of Natrona County High School with a 488.
