FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Hello Everyone!

Well, as I write this we're more than half way through the shooting season. F-class shooters have had matches almost every weekend since early June. They've been burning up the bullets at the local matches across Wyoming, Nebraska and Colorado. But this time of year, the shooting becomes more serious. The end of July saw the Wyoming Long Range State Championship shoot at the new Rawlins range. There was record attendance with 41 registered shooters from across the region: Utah 7, Colorado 4, Nebraska 3, Minnesota 2 and 25 from Wyoming. The weather was great both days, but the light winds from the NE caused problems for many of the shooters. Although the range is flat and smooth to the west, there are some berms on the east side of the range

which caused the issues. Oh well, that's what makes the best shooters stand out.

As I write, some of our regional shooters are in Ontario, Canada for two big shoots. The first is the Canadian F-Class Nationals, three days of shooting on an absolutely beautiful range. Immediately following the nationals is the F-Class World Championships. This consists of 3 days of individual shooting and 2 days of team shooting. The course of fire is 3 matches each day, shooting from 700, 800 and 900 meters 2 sighters and 15 shots for record at each distance (Palma). Best wishes to those who are there.

September will again have regional shooters on the move. The NRA F-Class Nationals will be held at Lodi, Wisconsin. Shooters will shoot at both mid-range Sept. 23-25 and long range Sept. 27-28. Good luck to

those who go and I hope the weather is better than last year.

That will wrap up the shooting for the year other than the odd shoot here and there. But we won't talk about the Frozen Chosen shoot in Cheyenne. Brrrr!
