Hunting-Conversation, Open

The By-Law Referendums were approved overwhelming.

Here is what the new changes mean.

1. There is no more complimentary memberships. With the event of the Web Site, there is no need for such memberships.
2. Four Board Officers must now be present for business to be conducted at meetings, instead of just two.
3. WSSA must now hold two membership meetings each year, instead of just one. {one in the spring and one in the fall}

4. As per the decision of the Board of Directors, the elections can be held either in the spring, or the fall meeting of the given year.
5. At least 60 days' notice is to be given prior to Membership Meetings, and elections must be held at such meetings. Clear and Specific guidelines are to be contained in the policy manual with regard to the election process. This is very similar to what the By-Laws say about the Dues, Fees, and State Championship Match Procedures.
